IQF pollock loin production will be very limited as well in B season.
Cod		•		•	The main Bering Sea Cod Trawl fishery is complete. We will continue to receive fish from state water fisheries and smaller openings throughout the spring and summer months. B season Trawl fishery will start in September.	The supply availability has been limited although we are starting to see inventories build as A season product arrives down from Alaska. Limited supply coupled with demand surge in food service, especially in QSR and fast serve has allowed prices to remain firm. Twice frozen product is experiencing shipping delays, limited container and cold storage availability as well as increased freight costs, supporting firm prices in the market.
